Summary Notes:

- 13% lower than state average for Offenses During Supervision. This means that while being treated in PLL, youth did not commit another offense while under PLL supervision or have any new charges.
- N=82 Successfully graduated more youth than any other Redirections program in the State
- Graduated 75% of the youth admitted to the program. This reflects a high degree of caregiver involvement, and is noteworthy given that such participation was not court ordered. Strong family engagement and change is a key reason for PLL's effectiveness.
- 74 Days is average length of stay = 31 fewer days or 30% less time on the program.
- 29% Recidivism = 13% percentage points lower) than the state average for the Redirection Project. Recidivism in the state of Florida is defined as any subsequent juvenile adjudication (including adjudication withheld) or adult conviction within one year of release.
